## In Loving Memory of Mother Cora Lee Williams

On February 2, 1931 Cora Lee Williams, was born to the late Tommy Lee and Mary Ella Wilson in Tallahassee, Florida. She was the youngest girl of nine siblings, seven preceded her in death. She received her education in the Leon County School System.



In her late teens she moved to High Springs, Florida where she met and married Elder James Williams, Jr., on July 9, 1947. To this union, ten (10) children were born; James Williams, Maxine Rushing, Margurite Aiken, Martha Landers, Helen Fletcher, Elaine Stuckman, Carolyn Reynolds, Walter Williams, and Ezra Williams.
